Terms of Use

1. What is the IAIS Core Curriculum?

The IAIS Core Curriculum Section (the “**Core Curriculum**”) is a learning tool provided by the International Association of Insurance Supervisors (the “**IAIS**”). The purpose of the Core Curriculum is to provide training materials in a variety of topics of relevance to insurance supervisors around the world and to foster the implementation of the IAIS Insurance Core Principles. The Core Curriculum is publicly available from the IAIS website.

This document (the “**Terms of Use**”) contains the terms on which access is granted to the Core Curriculum. Any users of the Core Curriculum shall comply with the Terms of Use.

2. Defined Terms

In these Terms of Use

- 2.1 “**Intellectual Property Rights**“ means any copyright, database rights, patents, patentable material, designs, trade secrets, confidential information, know-how, trademarks, service marks or other industrial or intellectual property rights, and any applications for any of the foregoing (whether registered or not and whether registrable or not); and
- 2.2 “**Core Curriculum Material**” means the content of the Core Curriculum as displayed on the IAIS website.

3. Information on Intellectual Property Rights / Permitted Use

- 3.1 All Intellectual Property Rights in the Core Curriculum Material are owned by the IAIS. Any rights not explicitly granted herein are reserved.
- 3.2 Users may download, display, print out, photocopy and redistribute the Core Curriculum Material for non-commercial educational purposes without any right to re-sell or otherwise re-distribute the material, or compile or create derivative material. The conditions for any other use of the Core Curriculum Material are set out below.
- 3.3 Users may reproduce or translate the Core Curriculum Material in other works subject to the following general conditions:

4. Access to the Core Curriculum

- 4.1 Until the termination of access to the Core Curriculum pursuant to clause 8, and without prejudice to any rights of the IAIS to suspend or withdraw access to the Core Curriculum, the IAIS hereby grants users, subject to these terms, each, non-exclusive, non-transferable and royalty-free access to the Core Curriculum.
- 4.2 Each user authorises the IAIS and its agents or contractors to access the data and statistics generated from the use of the Core Curriculum by its users.
- 4.3 The content of the Core Curriculum displayed on the IAIS website may be decided at the discretion of IAIS.

- 7.3 The IAIS and its agents and contractors may access the Core Curriculum at any time for any purpose, including the monitoring of compliance with these Terms of Use.

8. Termination of access to the Core Curriculum

If users fail to comply, or if the IAIS has reason to believe that users fail to comply, with any of these Terms of Use the IAIS may take any appropriate remedial measure, including the suspension or the withdrawal of access to the Core Curriculum, or the cessation of the provision of the Core Curriculum if necessary, at any time without prior notice.

9. Amendments to these Terms of Use

The IAIS may amend these Terms of Use at any time by posting an amendment notice on the IAIS website and by correspondingly amending these Terms of Use. The amendment shall become effective within the period of time specified in the notice.

10. Instructions

Each user shall follow any instructions given by the IAIS Secretariat regarding the use of the Core Curriculum, provided such instructions are consistent with these Terms of Use.

11. Governing law

These Terms of Use are governed by the laws of Switzerland and are subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the Canton of Basel-Stadt, Switzerland.
